

**TOWNSHIP OF RIDGEBURY
BRADFORD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA
ORDINANCE NO.: 63**

SUPERVISOR COMPENSATION

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has enacted Act 60 of 1995, setting forth certain Guidelines And Limitations For The Compensation Of Supervisors Of Townships Of The Second Class, and;

WHEREAS, the act provides that supervisors of townships having a population of not more than 4,999 may be compensated in an amount not to exceed \$1,875 per year, and;

WHEREAS, the population of Ridgebury Township is 1,982, and;

WHEREAS, the General Assembly by Act 60 authorizes the board of supervisors of the various townships of the second class to determine the compensation of supervisors subject to the limitations set for the in the act,

Now, therefore it is hereby enacted and ordained as follows:

1. Each supervisor of Ridgebury Township elected or appointed to office after the effective date of this ordinance shall receive compensation for attending duly advertised general or special public meetings or hearings of the board of supervisors, or other meetings authorized by the board of supervisors at the rate of \$75.00 for each meeting attended by such supervisor, not to exceed \$1,875 per year.
2. Such compensation shall be paid in monthly or quarterly installments.
3. Ordained and enacted as an Ordinance on this 7th day of April, 2004.

(Please note)

The Pennsylvania Constitution prohibits an elected official from approving and receiving an increase or decrease in compensation during the current term of office - Any change in supervisor compensation will not apply to supervisors in office when this ordinance takes effect and will only become effective upon election to another term.

The township's intent to adopt an ordinance must be advertised by one of the following methods:

- 1) The entire text of the ordinance must be published at least once, not more than 60 days nor less than seven days before passage; or
- 2) The title and a brief summary of the ordinance must be published, along with the location at which the full text may be examined, not more than 60 days nor less seven days before passage. A copy of the full text of the ordinance must be filed with the publishing newspaper, and after the ordinance is enacted, a copy of the full text must be filed with the agency designated by the county commissioners.
- 3) The ordinance's effective date may not be less than five days after enactment.)
